It symbolized our commitment to creating a society that is informed, compassionate, and supportive.



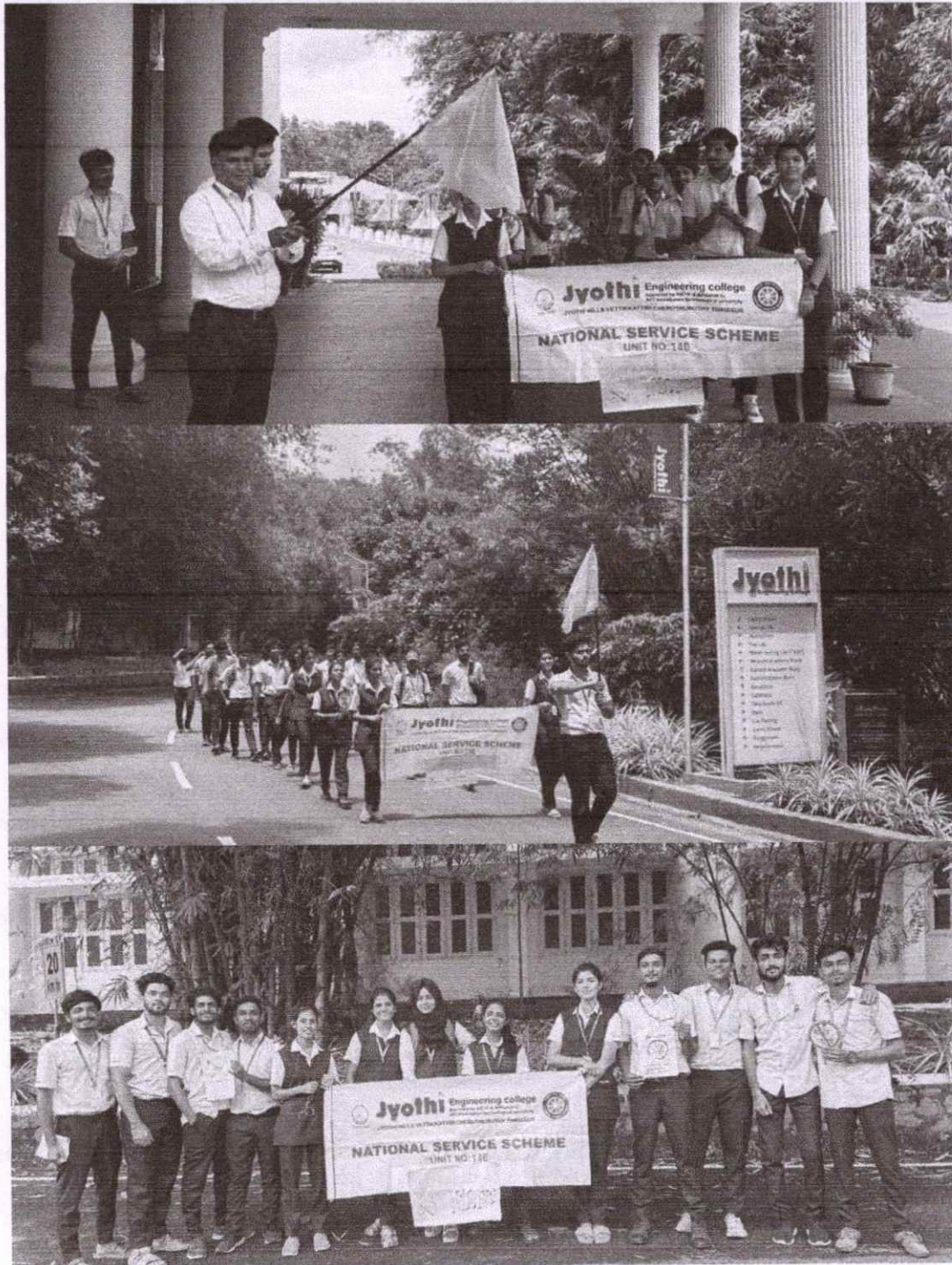
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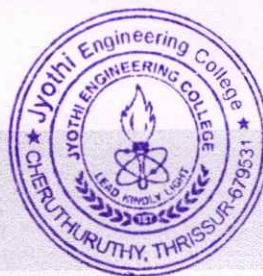

- We split into different groups of 4 members to distribute the sweets to every department.

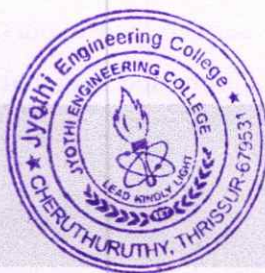

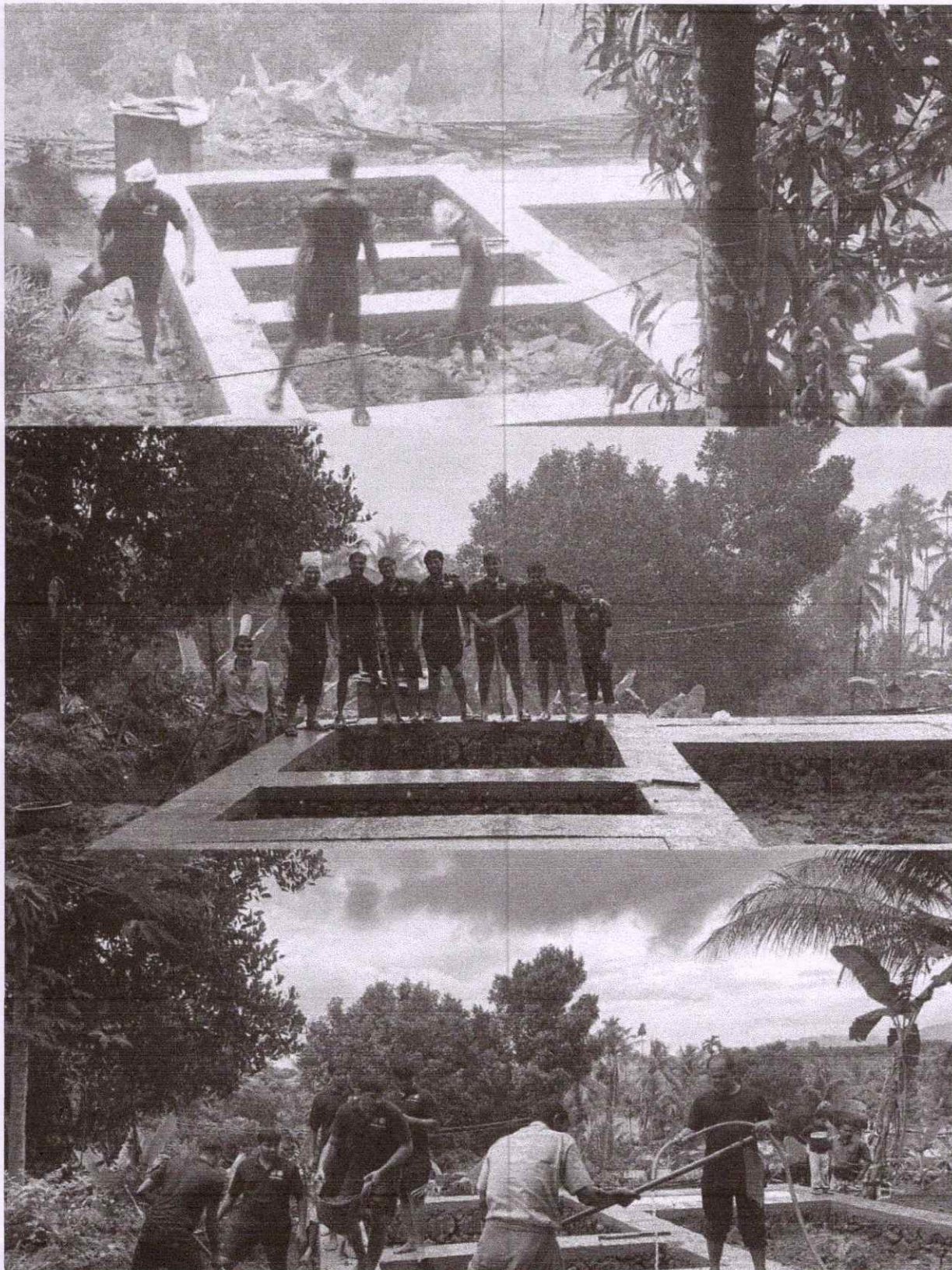
Introduction:
