## ANNUAL REPORT 2023-24

### 1. UNDERGRADUATE AND POST-GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

The college started with four B. Tech. programmes viz. Computer Science & Engineering, Electronics & Communication Engineering, Electrical & Electronics Engineering and Information Technology in 2002 with an annual intake of 60 each. At present we have 8 UG Programmes and 5 PG Programmes namely – B.Tech – Civil Engineering, Computer Science & Engineering, Electronics & Communication Engineering, Electrical & Electronics Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Mechatronics Engineering, Artificial Intelligence & Data Science, Computer Science & Engineering (Cyber Security) M.Tech. – Transportation Engineering, Computer Science & Engineering, Communication Engineering & Signal Processing, Power Electronics and Industrial Automation & Robotics. Due to the lack admissions in B.Tech Robotics & Automation, we closed this branch from the Academic year 2023-24. Also conducted Ph.D. Programmes in various departments.

### 2. ADMISSIONS

**2.1** As per the Government Agreement, 50% seats were allotted to the Government to be filled by the Commissioner of Entrance Examination. The remaining 50% will be filled by the management of the college. In this 50%, 35% will be filled by the management and 15% by dependents of the Non Resident Indian category.

The alumnae of 2011 Mechanical batch graduates established an Endowment of Rs. 75,000/- to give a scholarship of Rs. 5000/- per annum to a deserving candidate.

The alumnae association has donated Rs. 1,00,000/- towards an alumnae endowment from which the best final year student will be awarded each year.

Endowment by the Family of Fr. John Tharayil: Rev. Fr. John Tharyil’s family instituted an Endowment of Rs. 2,00,000/-. The interest of the endowment will be used for promoting students’ of first year batch.

### 7.7 Salary Structure of Teachers

All the faculty members are paid in the AICTE Scales. Retired Professors' salary is fixed after negotiating with them. Their salary is fixed after negotiating with them on the basis of their qualification and experience. Those who are on the regular Scale are paid 57% DA + HRA @Rs. 250/-.

### 7.8. Pay Structure of Non-Teaching Staff

The Pay Scales of Non-Teaching Staff was revised in line with the Government of Kerala Pay Revision 2016 w.e.f. 01.06.2016. The employees are covered by EPF and ESI Schemes. The current DA for Non-Teaching Staff is 12% w.e.f. 01.10.2024.

The government prescribed fee for B. Tech courses are Rs. 1,00,500/-. We are collecting only Rs. 90,000/- from each student giving the a scholarship of Rs. 10,000/-

The Government has fixed a Tuition fee of Rs. 45,000/- plus Special Fee of Rs. 10,000/- per semester for M. Tech. But we are charging only Rs. 21,000/- per semester.

**9.1** The Fee structure is uniform for both Government and Management Quota Students.

## 10. ADMISSION 2024– 25

New Admission strategy to attract more students has been planned considering the stiff competition in admission. More scholarships have proposed for all branches except Computer Science related branches.
